The highlight of our entire concert series was performing at Te Ahu for the children & parents/guardians of Kaitiaki. I was fantastic interacting with so many who listened to the story of Ruby May's adventures shaking a shaker, waving a scarf, listening to the music. & afterwards having a go on a small violin or cello or hearing up close a flute or recorder. The total number who attended the Te Ahu concert was 97.

Describe the main findings in your evaluation of the project/event; describe how your project/event benefited the community:

In total 43 children, 4 babies, 5 students, 5 Seniors + 40 adults attended.

NZ Barok was well supported in the Far North by Whina Te Whiu at Te Aha, sending over 1000 flyers to all the Kaiaia community + other parts of the region. 59 of the 89 who booked through Eventbrite attended with 38 turning up on the day. Some of those who attended had travelled quite a distance so their children could attend the concert. As a free event in a beautiful space (Te Aha Atrium) it brought music to the community. The story told during the concert was a truly bi-cultural one linking to the whenua of the area, the birds, and notes with waiata also included to sing together. This concert was an absolute success from NZ Barok's point of view.

As the grant was approved 16/7/19 + the concert was 27/7/19 brochure, programme + flyers were already printed. The programme itself did acknowledge Te Aha.
