 - Existing Open Drain

Existing concrete path through center of park.

Painted corrugated iron sculptures of native birds, such as Pukeko, Tui or Kereru.

Proposed picnic tables.

Proposed Specimen Trees.

Existing Vegetation.

Proposed sub-surface drains to connect into the existing open drain and improve the drainage of the lawn areas in winter.

Stormwater culvert pipe (underground).

Existing wastewater pipe (underground gravity main).

Existing Specimen trees with proposed seat under canopy.

Existing open drains, to be planted with wetland grass species.

Existing Vegetation.

Existing picnic tables.

Existing Playground.

Remove dead tree at park entrance.

Existing walkway/concrete path to Driftwood Lane.

Fences along existing walkway to be painted with artwork completed by local school children.

Proposed landscaped garden areas with low growing flaxes and grasses.

Corrugated Iron figures of children playing.

Existing timber fence along boundary to have painted artwork completed by local school children.

Proposed concrete pathway through park 1.2m wide.

Manhole location.

Remove this area of exotic vegetation to open up the view into the park (indicated dashed).

Sculptural figures of children playing.



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Remove existing post and wire fence preventing vehicle access to reserve and replace with timber bollards.

Proposed Specimen Pohutukawa Trees with additional picnic tables.

Existing Pohutukawa Trees.

Existing picnic table.

Riprap rock required to protect the road reserve from ongoing coastal erosion.

Proposed bollards to close off access to picnic table area.

Build up gravel parking areas between footpath and road to removal trip hazards throughout the area.

Existing Pohutukawa Tree.

Existing footpath and sea wall.

Proposed handrail to address fall height from footpath to sand below.

Esplanade Reserve currently used by camping ground, to be reinstated as a reserve.

Trees preventing access to the Reserve to be removed, timber bollards installed to prevent vehicle access.

Proposed driveway access to reserve.

Grassed summer parking overflow parking area.

Road Reserve Boundary.

Existing open drain/water table, if this was culverted the grass lawn areas on the road verge could then be use for summer time parking.
