## Twin Coast Cycle Trail: as reported by the Trail Manager

IT Connectivity Project is underway in the Utakura River section. A combination of solar or electrically powered boosters connected through Starlink will provide public access to WIFI connectivity.

### Permanent Route – Taumarere to Opuā – Whaingā 3.4 Innovation and Research

*Provide an alternative temporary route. Provide a connector train timetable programme. Updates on the design process for the Permanent Route from Taumarere to Opuā. Updates on stakeholder engagement.*

- Meeting invites have been sent to the hapu within the area to meet with the Design Tam in the next six weeks.
- The design and route have been finalised. This will be presented to KiwiRail for consideration of the application by the FNDC for a 30-year-plus lease.

### Business Case

The Trust is investigating the cost of data analysis to support a business case seeking funding to construct the new (permanent) route. It has received a quote for \$36,900.

Trust Deed: It is determined that the Trust should maintain, repair, develop and facilitate the use and enjoyment of a Cycle Trail on the terms set out in the Deed. (d) ensuring that the Cycle Trail is developed and maintained to the standard required for it to be included in the Nga Haerenga / National Cycleway Network; and (e) raising funds to carry out and complete any of the charitable purposes.

Precedent: In the past, the Trust Reserves have been used for the consultant fees for submitting to the proposed District Plan.

## Great Rides - Ngā Haerenga New Zealand Cycle Trails

- The NZCT has developed an E-Bike Policy to define power-assisted cycles as cycles with an auxiliary electric motor not exceeding 300W and are designed to be primarily propelled by the muscular energy of the rider.

When in doubt, the two questions to consider are:

1. Do the bikes have pedals that can be primarily used to propel them?
2. Is the motor power >300W?

Examples are not power-assisted cycles but are mopeds and therefore not allowed:

- Cycles fitted and operated by a throttle
  - Cycles fitted with petrol motors
  - Low powered scooters/mopeds
  - Cycles are designed primarily to be propelled by an engine, not the muscular energy of the rider.
- The NZCT board will be hosted by the PHTTCCT Trust and the Far North District Council to hold their regular meeting at the district during a visit from October 31 to November 4.
