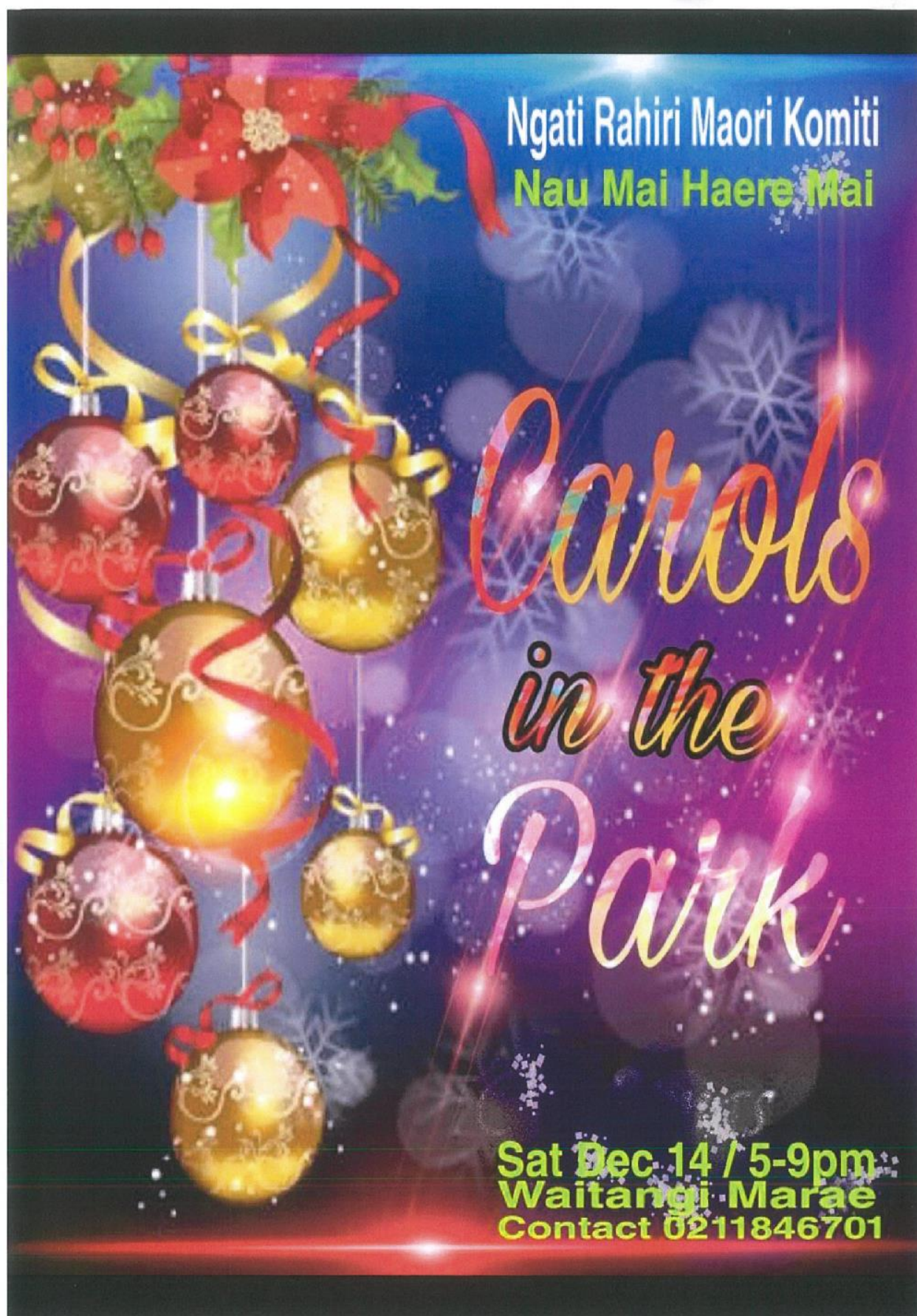

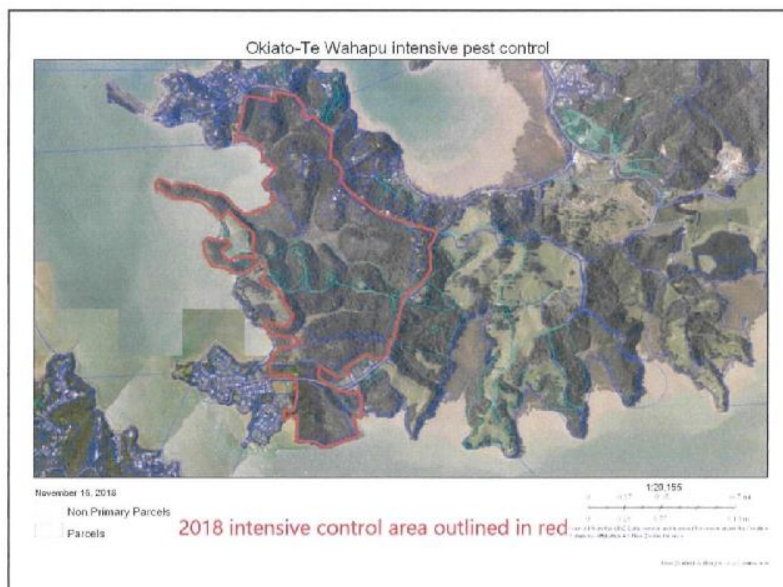


Pipiroa-Te Wahapu- community

- Twin catchments 250ha on Russell Peninsula
- Far North District Council lands 100ha- mostly scenic reserves
- Intensive predator control by Russell Landcare Trust
- Plant pest management, native replanting, aquatic management by Living Waters-Bay of Islands
- Includes part of Okiato-Russell Walkway (BOIWWT)

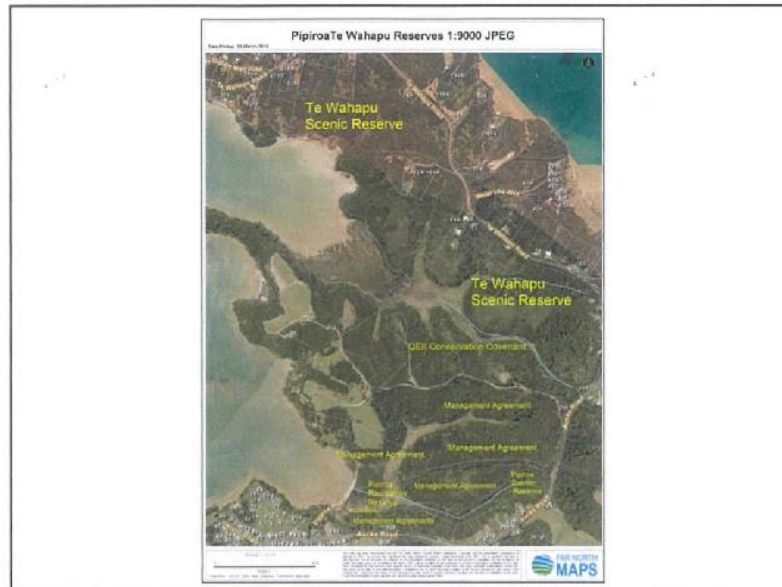
## Living Waters-BOI activities on FNDC lands



- **100ha Far North District Council lands-mainly scenic reserves**
- Over last year we held 30 volunteer working bees focusing on pest plant control and removing weeds from last four years of plantings
- Latest public wetland planting day May 2019

### Other biodiversity protection work in Pipiroa-Te Wahapu catchments

- Russell Landcare Trust Intensive predator control for both catchments (also predator control in a buffer area)
- Draft twin catchment ecological restoration strategy for consultation and finalising
- Design 12-13 interpretation panels for Okiato-Russell walkway for consultation
- Bird & other ecological monitoring
- Biodiversity property plans prepared for larger private holdings in the two catchments
- Project to largely eradicate pest plants in 42ha of covenants
- Removal key pest plant species elsewhere in catchment

### Living Waters-Bay of Islands (LW) & Russell Landcare Trust (RLT)



- LW has a signed management agreement with Council
- LW has been working in two catchments since 2015
- RLT intensive animal predator control started in Pipiroa in Nov 2016 with rest of two catchments covered over next six months
- Application is for both LW funding and RLT funding
- If not fully funded, could the Community Board please indicate what portion is for intensive predator control
