The trip was made up with 120 people on Board the Explore Vessel. 15 Students + Teachers, 12 Northland people and 51 people representing the Australasian Historical Archaeologists (both NZ & Australian). Marie Clenden and Dame Anne Salmond provided a bicultural dimension to the experience with their knowledgeable commentary. The historic educational content was great.

Including Northland Students & Teachers in our trip was a first for our organisation. We would best say it was a great success. 
