The total number of students who participated over the three days in the Far North District Council was 1,080.

For Kaikohe-Hokianga, the Host School was Kaikohe Christian School. And the number of students who participated from host and guest schools was 573, made up of; Kaikohe Christian School (131) Tautoro School (16) Ohaeawai (140) Kaikohe East (60) Harvest School (44) Kaikohe Intermediate (14) Kaikohe West School (168) With over 100 spectators.

#### Describe the main findings in your evaluation of the project/event; describe how your project/ event benefited the community:

Overwhelmingly positive feedback was received from schools that participated, and from the Healthy Active Learning staff at the regional sports trusts we worked alongside.

Sport Northland Feedback:

"It helped inspire children and teachers to be more active. The event also led to some Kaiako having conversations about what the potential is to incorporate different activities within the interschool cross country to make it more fun and interactive for Tamariki. It also allowed children with physical impairments to participate.

The set up worked well and school hosts actively participated on the day. It was also great for the community to be involved such as the Kaikohe fire brigade. The low barrier of entry for all participants, not being the traditional triathlon-type event, meant that all Tamariki regardless of their background could enter and have fun." - Ashleigh Ellis, Healthy Active Learning Support and Sport Northland team.
