

PROPOSED PUKENUI SCENIC WALKWAY



VISION

Although the walkway will be widely used by residents I am wanting feature boardwalks that will bring tourists to Te Hiku, a must do for visitors to the Far North.

The goal is to reduce the number of overstayers in Paihia.

They will want to come further north to go to Cape Reinga using our local companies and staying longer in Te Hiku to experience our worldclass coastal walkways.

The Pukenui boardwalk would start at the commercial wharf, run along the cliff face following the harbour channel to end at the Lambs Bridge reserve.

There would be an extended deck/area for anglers to fish at one or two positions along the boardwalk.

Long term plan would be to link the coastal walk with Arethusa Reserve Lamb Road this would be approximately 1.5hr walk.

The boardwalk needs to be wide enough for runners to pass pedestrians.

The structure would help with any future erosion of the cliff/hill sides.

The construction of the walkway will bring huge economic benefits including job opportunities to our communities.
