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			turn, for him to grant Council easement over his
			land which allows access over a corridor on his
			land to access the reserve.
			If one was to use the ROW at the far end of the
			property, the dominant tenements may be
			required. The public could then access the paper
			road which takes them onto the reserve.
			For Mr Palmer, the issue may be security and
			interference with his farming operations currently
			conducted on the land.
			The reserve is definitely worthwhile preserving,
			but while there is no easy access, difficult to justify spending time and money on creating a
			management plan that would be difficult to
			implement.
			The current cost to do a basic weed control
			exercise is \$20,000 (excl. any potential Heritage
			NZ costs) with an on-going cost being approx.
			\$5-\$10,000 annually.
